Monday-Thursday (check-out in am), April 8-April 11

3-Night stay in sunny Southern California (it never rains there): Lodging (see below) in Oxnard, California (west of LA, south of Santa Barbara & much cheaper).

Monday - Get settled in. Then, we could drive up to Santa Barbara to catch the Spanish architecture at sunset.






# Simple Maniplation to Add Impact

Most graphics manipulation programs have the burn and dodge tools. They are simple to use and can give results that will improve most any image.





The most important thing to remember whan using any tool that allows you to control the flow, such as the exposure here in the burn and dodge tools, is they may work best at very low exposure levels. This will give you the control needed to work slowly on specific areas of the image.



Below is the before and after. Not much change, but maybe enough to add a couple of points to your score.
