

How to upload photos to the Website

Filmpack.org

- 1 Select the images you would like to upload to the website and rename them to those names you would like to appear with them on the website
- 2. Access the website using the url <u>www.filmpack.org</u>
- a. On the homepage, click on "Members Gallery".
- b. On Member's Gallery page, click on "Identification".
- c. In "Username" type your name as it appears on the membership list
- d. In "Password" type your pre-arranged password, or if you have never logged in before, type your first name followed by a "1" (one).

If all has gone as expected, the choice in the Identification menu will change to "Logout" indicating that you are logged in.

3. Click on "Menu"

- a. You'll be offered several choices. At the bottom of the list, choose "Upload Photos"
- b. The next screen will offer you the choice of "Drop into existing album" or "Create a new Album".
- c. If you choose "Drop into existing album" you'll be presented with a drop down list which offers several choices of albums.
- d. You can create a personal album by selecting "members/(your name)".

You can add to a photo tour album by selecting the name of the tour.

4. In the box labeled "Select Files", click "Browse".

- a. This will bring up a representation of your computer desktop.
- b. Open folders or scroll until you find the picture you want to upload, +then click "upload"
- c. The photo is now uploaded to the album you have selected.

You can repeat step b as often as you like, though most members limit themselves to twenty pictures.

5. When you have finished uploading your photos, go back to the "Identification" menu and log out.

6. A few things to note.

- a. Pictures are normally displayed in a 500 by 600 pixel space, so for speed you can limit your maximum dimension to 600 pixels.
- b. You can upload far more detail than that, in which case your picture can be displayed in "hi-definition" by any user. It can also be copied by any user, so if you upload a high resolution picture, you are giving away control of your photos.
- c. You cannot, at this time, delete or re-arrange the photos in your album, so choose your photos and their order carefully. You can change your password by going to the "Identification" menu and choosing "Customize"
- d. If you lose your password or if for some reason it doesn't work, you will be offered a new arbitrary password via Email. Once logged in, you can change that password to one of your choice.

Presidents Message: Saving and Organizing Pictures

Here is a problem all photographers need to deal with - how to store and organize all our pictures. I know many of us have no system. We end up with pictures all over our computer in different folders. The default method often used is naming a folder and moving the associated pictures into them; i.e. "Beach July 2006" or "Summer 2009". This can work but really does not organize your pictures in any meaning full manner. If this is your method I suggest you name your folders by date using the prefix "YYMM"; i.e. "0907 Beach" or "0906 Summer". That will at least sort the folders in date order. Then place all the folders in a single location on your computer so that you can easily locate any folder.

If you want a more sophisticated method you probably have it built into your photo editing software. Most of us are using Adobe Elements, Lightroom or Photoshop. Each of these has its own tools for organizing your pictures and they are very comprehensive. There is a learning process required for each of these products.

Elements was created for the armature photographer. It has grown to now include many creative features for the more serious photographer. For pure value and power at a reasonable cost it is hard to beat. Elements "Organizer" allows you to batch rename pictures, create albums by subject matter and use keywords (tags). Individual pictures from different albums can be collected into Catalogs for presentation such as slide shows or printing contact sheets. There are many sources on information to help learn how to use the Organizer in Elements.

Photoshop uses Bridge. Because Bridge does not have a keyword feature it has some short comings as a great photo organizer but it is good at rating your pictures as to quality and locating them by the rating. It has several methods of doing this using stars or a label. You can create folders as described in the first paragraph and define the folders to Bridge as favorities so that they are very easy to access.

The most powerful at organizing pictures is Lightroom. It was developed by Adobe for first being a picture organizer and second a picture editor. It is for the person that has a very large archive of pictures but does only the basics of editing. Lightroom was designed for the professional photo journalists that needs to save tens of thousands of pictures but only needs the basic editing functions such as cropping, brightening & sharpening and the not creative features available in Photoshop. The learning curve for Lightroom is a bit longer than Elements.

There are many other picture organizers such as ACDSEE, Picasa & Thumbsplus. They each have the strong points and short comings. Some of these organizers save your pictures in the "cloud". This has advantages and disadvantages. It is nice to have a backup off site in case your computer crashes & burns but there is a history of these companies failing or changing ownership with their policies and storage methods changing. Also privacy and maintaining control of your pictures is always a concern. Picasa has been recently acquired by Google which is changing how pictures stored there are being managed.

I do suggest that you establish a standard process for managing your pictures. By that I mean that you always follow the same procedure when loading pictures on to your computer. For example I always copy all my pictures first into a Folder I created for just that purpose. I named that folder "Unloaded". I then use Bridge "Batch Rename" to rename all the pictures by date and sequence number - "YYMMDD0001, YYMMDD0002, etc." By naming them in that order I can always find any picture by date. Elements also can batch rename pictures. You can get help on using Elements to batch rename at http://www.easyelements.com/batch-file-rename.html. I then delete those pictures that I do not want to keep. The remaining pictures I then sort into Folders that I created by subject matter; i.e. "Animals, Flowers & Vegetation, Landscapes, People, etc. I have about 25 such folders and it is easy to sort into them because I have made them Favorites in Bridge. During the process of sorting them into the appropriate folder I will rate pictures with stars indicating my interest in coming back later to edit pictures for competition purposes.

The important thing is to have your own system and follow it consistently.
